Letter from our President

2010 - what a year!!

These are items you have been asking about concerning the Library

1: THE NEW ALPHARETTA LIBRARY SITE:

Project managers, Heery/Russell, have been chosen for the new libraries / renovations within the system. The bonds are in the process of being sold. The first libraries to be built are those where land had already been donated. The Alpharetta Library site is still being studied. No specific site has been selected, as far as we know. 2. CURRENT STAFF:

Many of you have commented about the current lack of staff members. Several positions are vacant. We understand that the Young Adult position has been eliminated so the Children's Librarian will now also responsible for the Young Adult responsibilities. Also needed is a person to fill a full-time position vacated when Irene Fields retired in December. Ms. Fields was an immeasurable help to the Friends and the patrons. We are hopeful that interviews will be held very soon to help find suitable individuals to fill these much-needed positions. We are often the 4th busiest library in the system so please give thanks to the remaining five full-time workers and the two part-time workers who are doing extra duty to meet the needs of the patrons.

3. THE FRIENDS OF THE ALPHARETTA LIBRARY VOLUNTEERS:

IN 2010 FOTAL volunteers donated over 6,000 hours. The top four volunteers within the entire 34 facility library system were FOTAL volunteers. All volunteers were recognized at a downtown volunteer reception last April.

4. BOOK DONATIONS:

Book donations from our citizens are at a ten-year high as far as number of books donated for our sales. Many of these books are put onto the shelves for check out inside the library whereas many are sold at our monthly book sales. Thank you for the donations. We are also proud that the Mayor and the City Council of Alpharetta recognize our efforts and present us with a \$10,000 check yearly.

The Bomb

Copied from the design of the WWII bomb disposal badge, the represents the historic and major objective of the EOD attack, the unexploded bomb. The 3 fins represent the major areas of nuclear, conventional and chemical/biological interest.

The Lightening Bolts

Symbolize the potential destructive power of the bomb, & the courage & professionalism of EOD personnel in their endeavors to render explosive ordnance harmless.

The Shield

Represents the EOD mission to protect personnel and property to the utmost, and to prevent detonation.









Note From Afghanistan:

In previous newsletters we've included letters from the Soldiers who have received donations of books, DVDs and games from FOTAL plus Cards **you've** written at our Book Sales (or your children have written). An e-mail from 'David' was received in December that speaks volumes about how they feel about getting the "care/goodie boxes".

"I like to let the folks at home know that the packages that they took such care and trouble to put together made it somewhere and that they are appreciated. I am also including some pics of us here at FOB WARRIOR. There are only about 50 American troops here including the 6 of us, and all the rest are Polish troops or contractors. "... he goes on to say that it has been hard to communicate with them due to the language barriers. They are teaching them new ways of 'warfare' as they are pretty old-school Russian trained. He mentioned wanting to learn Polish through the Rosetta Stone learning process and asked if we found one, they'd appreciate it. So, FOTAL purchased a new copy and it is in the mail to him.

I've not included a description of what this troop does but they are 'EOD' which translates to Explosive Ordinance Detonation... so they find bombs that have not blown up and blow them up! Yikes! David enclosed their LOGO and description which you see at the top of the page.

We've corresponded several times – he's from Delaware and feels our pain over the cold weather. But, who can complain when we're in the US and they aren't. Keep those cards coming – please!
