## Letter from our President, Ben Statham

I am proud to be a volunteer for FOTAL. We are a local group of volunteers who recognize that in this time of a tight budget, we can make a difference in the lives of the citizens of Alpharetta by helping to improve the services of the Alpharetta Library. The Friends realize that by improving the quality of services of the local library, they then enhance the quality of life for the citizens of Alpharetta

We thank our members, the Mayor and City Council of Alpharetta and the community for their support both through monetary gifts and book donations for our sales as well as their attendance at our monthly sales. These gifts enable us to accomplish our goals. We are a devoted organization with a dedicated mission to enhance literary skills, to put books in people's hands and homes and to promote the need for adequate library facilities. FOTAL'S 2009 budget allowed the Friends to purchase materials, pay for children's programs, buy books and tapes and any other items the librarians need to keep our library one of the busiest in the system as evidenced by its circulation numbers. Despite being only a10,000 square foot library and competing with regional 25,000 square foot libraries, of the 34 in the system, Alpharetta is the 4th highest in circulation numbers each month. We are fortunate to have such a hard working staff.

#### 2009 Accomplishments:

- Donated thousands of books to school libraries, Foster Care programs, area nursing homes and a Senior Center, South Fulton
- Library for their book sale, Northside Hospital for patients, a low-income school in Rome, GA, a school for children with learning disorders, and many other needy recipients.
- Over 1000 donated children's books were processed by FOTAL volunteers and placed onto the shelves of the library during the past two years.
   Taxpayers were saved thousands of tax dollars and made more books available.
- Enhancement of the interior and exterior of the library by way of holiday decor, flowers, bird feeders, etc.
- Bookcases donated to Habitat for Humanity.
- Three Scholarships given to area high school Seniors.
- Books, DVD's, and supplies sent to soldiers around the world.
- A Craft Show in May for local artists.
- Support of the Alpharetta Girl Scout's refreshment booth at our monthly sales.

## **Book Sales**

The Monthly Book Sales are a large part of our revenue. All books, with the exception of Library discards, come by way of donations from our friends and neighbors. The 'regulars' at our monthly book sales are true recyclers; they return the books read as donations and purchase 'new' ones.

Volunteers sort the books and price them as they come into the Donation Basket. On average, at least 200 books are donated weekly. Some publications we would rather not receive are:

- Readers' Digest/ Book Club editions,
- magazines,
- books that are torn, moldy or mildewed,
- trade publications,
- encyclopedias,
- phone books

In addition to the monthly sales, FOTAL sells books on-line. There are a wide variety available from text books to popular novels and old classics. Look at our WEBSITE for news and general information.

## **Books for Soldiers**



The most rewarding volunteer job for me is the Books for Soldiers campaign. We are a member of a National, totally Volunteer Organization that receive requests from Soldiers all over the world.

In 2009, FOTAL sent 98 boxes to our Men and Woman in Afghanistan, Iraq, North Africa, Germany and Korea. Many times, for security reasons, the locations are unknown. All we do know is that someone out there, defending our Freedom, could use a good book, a movie, some candy, a puzzle, a cheerful note from home - anything to pass the time when they are not busy.

576 books, 320 DVDs and XBox games, phone cards, mini recordable DVDs and untold amounts of snacks and drink mixes were sent. Donations come from our Patrons at the Book Sales, Aramark, Happy Healthy Snacks, Sam's Club, and a Walgreen's employee plus FOTAL, of course. We pay for all postage.

The heartbreaker is a group called the 'Forgotten Soldiers'. According to their commanders, they receive little to no mail from home. Many times all that is asked for is just a letter of support. How can we not give?

Thank you if you've donated books or money, OR have signed a postcard at our table - the return is priceless.
