HAPPY 25TH. BIRTHDAY TO THE FRIENDS OF THE ALPHARETTA LIBRARY

We are pleased to be celebrating the 25th anniversary of the Friends of the Alpharetta Library (FOTAL). The Friends have enjoyed a quarter century of providing funds and goodwill to the library and to the citizens of the area. This non-profit volunteer group has worked diligently to supplement the library's budget in order to provide additional materials and programs for our growing community.

The first library in Alpharetta opened in 1966. For a few years it was in the former City Hall building. Early in 1986, because of renovations to the municipal building, the branch was moved to a downtown commercial building to await the construction of a new facility that was to be built with bond funds approved by voters.

With the support of the City of Alpharetta, bond funds and a generous donation from Louie and Gertrude Jones, a library was built at the corner of Mayfield Rd. and Canton St. in the Fall of 1989. The city and the surrounding North Fulton area was growing at a rapid pace and the librarians were extremely busy trying to meet the needs of the community. Ladye Heisel was the Children's librarian in 1991 and she asked Mary Anderson and Ben Statham if they would be interested in reviving the existence of a former Friends group. Mary became the President. Tony Pennock and Ben Statham became the book sale chairmen. Linda Statham was the Secretary and Treasurer. Charlotte Richter was appointed the volunteer coordinator. Becky Garrett was head of publicity and Jeannie Lewis was membership chairman. That was in September, 1991. The Friends were off and running!

We started with one book sale a year. Then we started having a sale two times a year. So many books were being donated for the sales and storage was a problem so Barbara Mitchell said to Ben, "Ben, we need monthly sales to meet the needs of the reading community." In the mid 90's, the Friends, under the leadership of Charlotte Richter, Larry Curry and Pam Caird, became a non-profit 501 c3 organization.

Ten years ago Kathleen Smith said, "Ben, we need to start selling some of these expensive books that aren't selling at our monthly book sale on the internet." She started listing books online along with the help of lain Caird, Linda Statham, Ben Statham, Jo Davisson, Bill Ohlemueller and Gerrie Fornek. As of today, we continue to raise funds with the monthly book sales and the online sales to pay for Children's and Young Adult programs, Adult programs, supplies, scholarships, supplies for the Books for Soldier's program and donations to other non-profits and local schools. Along with the book sales and the online sales, Gerrie Fornek, Barbara Selwyn and their energetic volunteers, have opened a very successful Book Store inside our new current library which opened in July of 2015. The book store is now open seven days a week. The book store volunteers work like busy bees keeping the shelves and carts loaded with the latest and greatest books, all at very reasonable prices.

FOTAL'S SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM



Scholarships have been awarded by FOTAL for 21 years.

We started the program based on the Friends mission which is to encourage literacy, promote the library's programs and be an integral part of the community.

In 2016, FOTAL increased both the number and monetary amount of the scholarships. The requirements have remained constant: submit an application as a graduating senior in the Alpharetta area schools, provide an acceptance letter from a college or university, include a list of school achievements and extracurricular activities and write an essay of 250-500 words about 'the importance of a free, public library system in today's society'.

More applications were received than ever before from which 9 were chosen. The teens were accepted at a variety of schools: UGA, Georgia Tech, Carnegie-Mellon, MIT, Clemson, Syracuse, Cornell, USC, Georgia State, Coastal Carolina, Auburn. So impressive!

Applications will be available through the local high school Media Specialists or Scholarship Coordinators and on-line through our website: FOTAL.org. (The forms will be made available starting 3/1/17 and due to the Friends on 4/15/17. None will be accepted after that date. Look for the announcement and take advantage of this program.

2016 LIBRARY ACTIVIES AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS

It might seem a little out of date to talk about last SUMMER's PROGRAMS, but 2016's Reading Program and the Events held were the largest, most attended in Alpharetta Library's history. This Library Staff deserves a standing ovation providing so much for the Community. It was a herculean effort! More importantly - continued cheers go to them as they are understaffed but always there for all of us.

In June, 2016 there were 29 programs, attended by 1716 children. Due to the increase in patrons for children's programming, the library offered special summer reading events IN ADDITION to the monthly and weekly events. Attendance was astronomical - the Mobile Petting Zoo drew in a crowd that exceeded 400 people! (It was held in June.) July had 21 programs attended by 1056 children. The most popular of programs was the Harry Potter Birthday Bash which will likely become an annual end of summer reading event. It was attended by approximately 288 members of the community, most of whom came in costume It wrapped up a truly incredible and impressive first full summer at the new Alpharetta Branch.

The children attending the programs registered from 15 different schools; Alpharetta Elementary school led with 152 attendees. The most active ages were 5 - 10 year old. 7 year olds were the largest group.

The READING PROGRAM was also phenomenal. 384 children completed the program and read 7,328 books. 27 Teens completed the program, reading a total of 220 books! 51% of all participants read only 10 books (the minimum goal). 49% read an additional book or so and 80% read up to 29 books. 2 of the participants read more than 100 books.
