<u>HIGH SCHOOL READING LISTS</u>

PARKS & RECREATION - THE ALPHARETTA ART CENTER

FOTAL met with the new Director of Parks and Rec., Mr. Morgan Rodgers, in July. The Art Center will be opening in our OLD Library Building (CORNER OF MAYFIELD AND CANTON) in October and is going to be a great addition to the community. It has gone through serious remodeling!

Many years ago, FOTAL purchased a bench in honor of a much loved librarian -Libby Covett, but when we moved to the new library, there wasn't a place for it. We've been looking for a new home for the past 3 years. When this was mentioned to Mr. Rodgers, he generously offered to find a new home for it somewhere on the original grounds. Look for it when you go to the Art Center. Thank you very much, Mr. Rodgers.

ALPHARETTA ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

For several years, FOTAL and AES became partners. We proposed that if AES could write a Grant that is in keeping with the Friends of the Library's mission (to promote literacy) we would try to fund their needs. The Principal and Media Specialist wanted all students to have 'Studies Weekly' as an addition to their classroom materials. FOTAL funded the subscription for the last 2 years now. Its use improved the range of topics in science and social studies available, provided an online component, real aloud areas to improve reading skills and equal access to all materials for grades 3 - 5. The use of this resource resulted in a 28% improvement in Social Studies and Science on the Georgia Milestones. Principal Kathleen Stamper attributes the improvements to increased vital information and access to these areas of study.

FOTAL has been sending 4 - 6 boxes of books, snacks, movies and toiletries monthly to men and women in the Armed Service around the world since about 2004. Included is always a card or note written by kids who come to the Monthly Saturday Sales. A return letter is never expected because we seldom know where the soldiers are located. But, every once in awhile we do get a letter of 'thanks'. This is one we wanted to share.

Department of the Army 1-115th Combined Arms Battalion Camp Buehring, Kuwait

Dear Alpharetta Library Crew.

I first want to say think you for all the snacks and goodies you sent my Company. The first time I was over here in 2003 the support from the American public was overwhelming and to see strangers still sending packages today makes me proud to wear this uniform. Regardless of where we come from, who we vote for, or what street we live on, there is a fundamental respect for what my soldiers and their families sacrifice. Your young men and women serving in a volunteer military to protect our freedoms for citizens that we have not and likely will never meet is an action you will only see in the United States. Only in America do we see strangers helping strangers, and your care package is one example of this support.

The Soldiers of Hurricane Company 1-155 are in good spirits as we continue to train and prepare for any mission that is given to us in support of Operation Spartan Shield. As a battalion, we are currently in four different countries and respect for the Mississippi Rifles continues to grow every day. We are Citizen Soldiers who signed up for one weekend a month, two weeks a year, and when called by our country we put the uniform on daily just like our active duty counterparts. The 1-155 is the oldest National Guard unit dating back as far as 1799 and the 7th oldest infantry regiment in the United States Army. Our motto, "Stand Fast", comes from the battle of Buena Vista from Colonel Jefferson Davis. While others turned to run away, the Mississippi Rifleman stayed and fought, eventually winning the battle. We continue to live this creed as we train daily on our soldier tasks that are vital for our mission success. Thank you once again,


