LIBRARY ANNUAL SURVEY RESULTS

The Atlanta Public Library system recently conducted their annual **Library User** survey. A record-breaking 16,000 responses were received with a few surprising results. Some information like demographics were collected - how many times the Library is visted versus using digital resources. The key points were:

- .. the majority of users are female: 60%. Last year it was 72% so men are catching up.
- .. all ages were represented. A surprising 40% of users were between 25 44.
- .. library users are educated. More than 55% have a college degree.
- .. 40% of those surveyed come into the library 3 4 times a month.
- .. 87% of all responders are satisfied with the customer service and experience.

FOTAL's Scholarship Program

Scholarships have been awarded by FOTAL for 25 years. The program is based on the National Friends mission which is to encourage literacy, promote the library's programs and be an integral part of the community.

In 2016, FOTAL increased both the number and monetary amount of the scholarships. The requirements have remained constant: submit an application as a graduating senior in our Alpharetta area, provide an acceptance letter from a college, university, or a continuing education institution, include a list of school achievements and extracurricular activities and write an essay of 250-500 words as to 'the importance of a free, public library system in today's society'.

At the beginning of 2018, we will again notify the schools in the Alpharetta City Limits (high schools, home schools and Continuing Education) of the Scholarship Program, its requirements and availability.



The Friends of the Alpharetta Library presented three \$500 scholarships to 2017 graduating seniors in the Alpharetta area.

<u>Gillian Lynn Rivera of Veritas,</u> will attend UGA and the College of Engineering.

<u>Jen McCall of Veritas,</u> will attend Truett McConnell in the field of nursing, and

<u>Hamza Tanzeem</u> of Alpharetta High School, will attend Purdue in the Engineering College.

FOTAL also provides a \$500 scholarship each year to individuals who are working towards their GED. The Ralph and Katie Johnson Scholarship helps students defray the cost of their tests as they earn their GED certificate.
